Camps

Waddington Ski Camp / Short Traverse

April 23 to May 8, 2005

Main Purpose: To enjoy the grandest part of the grand panorama of the Waddington range.

Access: Fly-in, fly-out, from Tatla Lake.

General Plan: The most spectacular parts of the Waddington Range are its northern aspects. After a brief traverse across the great cirque of the Radiant glacier and the upper Cataract area (two or three moving days), we will settle on the upper Tellot, close to the Plummer Hut, moving camp only once from one side of the glacier to the other.

Specifics: We will fly to the Chaos col (7500 ft), stay there for 1-2 days to acclimatize, move across the Radiant Cirque and up to the Unicorn col (8000 ft), and perhaps stay there for another day. There are several easy peaks (and many difficult ones) close to the camp areas. If there is enough expertise and stomach in the group, we will go directly to the upper Tellot (10,000+ ft), up a gully where we will likely need protection and crampons. If not, we will detour half-way down the Unicorn Gl (good skiing), over to and up the Cataract Gl to the Tellot. We will camp in the spots with the best views (good tents are essential). We will move as a group, but activities in and from camps are left to ad-hoc arrangements.

Difficulty: Skiing and touring is generally straightforward, approx. B-3. The gully to the upper Tellot would be a B-4.

Equipment: The usual ski gear plus: glacier gear, crampons, strong tents. We will take the Club's satellite phone. There will be a food drop at the Plummer Hut.

Party Size: 6 – 12.

Cost: Approximately \$850 including travel to Tatla Lake.

Rogers Pass offers spectacular vistas and impressive opportunities for hiking, scrambling and climbing. To facilitate a wide variety of daytrips, this self-guided camp will feature three days (two nights) tenting at Hermit Meadows and another three days (two nights) based out of the Asulkan Cabin. There will be four nights spent at the Wheeler Hut. The camp will include a knots and rope handling refresher and glacier travel orientation. Objectives will depend on conditions and experience level of participants.

This is a self-guided camp for club members. \$375 (+/-) covers food, hut fees, backcountry fees (but not parking). The ACC and "roofed accommodation" in BC Parks

The following is summarized from a fact sheet released by the ACC, dated February 24, 2005.

The Alpine Club of Canada has been involved in the BC government's possible initiative to allow "roofed accommodation" projects to take place in BC provincial parks in two ways:

1. Participation in a Ministry of Water Land and Air Protection (WLAP) advisory group for WLAP policy formulation regarding possible roofed accommodation projects in BC Parks, and
2. Submission of a proposal by the ACC to WLAP to construct an "eco-lodge" near Berg Lake in Mt Robson Provincial Park.

In November 2003 WLAP issued a press release announcing it had introduced "...new legislation that will establish BC's parks as an international tourism destination and offer new resort and recreation opportunities to British Columbians and visitors." In early 2004 WLAP struck an advisory group of public stakeholder representatives to advise WLAP in drafting its policy and strategy for any possible "roofed accommodation" projects in parks. WLAP invited the ACC to participate. Bruce Keith is the ACC representative. To the best of ACC's knowledge, no "roofed accommodation" policy or strategy for BC provincial parks has yet been issued by WLAP. However a draft version of a portion of the policy was recently made public.

ACC and "roofed accommodation" continued from Page 3

In October 2004 the ACC National office submitted to WLAP a proposal to construct an "eco-lodge" near Berg Lake in Mt Robson Provincial Park as part of its centennial activities. This project would be an environmentally sensitive mountain hut similar to the 23 huts currently operated by the ACC in BC and Alberta. It would have a minimal footprint, would have capacity for up to 30 people in hostel-style bunks in 2-4 rooms, and heating, cooking and eating would be "self-service".

The ACC expects that, should WLAP decide to proceed with the construction of a hut near Berg Lake, the Ministry will do so in accordance with what the club expects will be specified in WLAP's planned "roofed accommodation" policy for BC provincial parks, i.e. that WLAP will proceed on the basis of a public "request for proposal", followed by full environmental assessments and public consultation. The ACC believes that a hut near Berg Lake will be welcomed by mountaineers, hikers, skiers and other groups, and that it may reduce the use of the campsite in the same area, thereby offering BC Parks the opportunity to reduce the footprint of the campsite.

WINTER/SPRING 2005

GRADING GUIDELINES

- A - Less than 6 hrs travel/day (not strenuous)
- B - 6 to 8 hrs travel/day (moderately strenuous)
- C - 8 to 12 hrs travel/day (strenuous)
- D - More than 12 hrs travel/day (extremely strenuous)
- S - Slower-paced trip, (suitable for seniors)

- 1 - Gentle slopes. Travel on trails over fairly level terrain.
- 2 - Moderate slopes. Travel may be off trail. Intermediate skiing ability recommended. Easy climbing.
- 3 - Travel in mountainous terrain. Steep forest and glaciers probable. Backcountry equipment and intermediate skiing experience required. Moderate climbing.
- 4 - Travel over difficult mountain terrain. Advanced backcountry and mountaineering experience, ability and equipment required. Advanced ski mountaineering or moderate to difficult ice or mixed climbing. Ropes and belays required.
- 5 - Technical ice or mixed climbing. Advanced climbing experience required.

Please contact trip organizers by the Wednesday prior to the trip or earlier to express your interest. Non-members are welcome to participate once or twice before joining, and are accepted on a space available basis.. Everyone is welcome to attend our meetings at 7:30pm in the Floral Hall of Van Dusen Botanical Gardens, W. 37th Ave. & Oak St in Vancouver on the fourth Tuesday of every month (except July, Aug, Dec).

Trip organizers are required to have participants sign the ACC waiver which can be obtained from the climbing schedule organizer, or from: www.aebc.com/acc.
